Nancy rode the Tiger and we had to get a picture with the Hippocampus, cause it's kinda


both our favorite and, of course, I rode the dog!!!

Article II: Object

Add Section 2 and renumber Sections

Proposed to read:

Section 2: Life Active membership to ESAF and Rocky Mountain Council Endowment RMRC obtained a Life Active Membership to ESAF effective 2013.

RMRC established the Rocky Mountain Council Endowment in October 2013.

Reason for addition:

To clarify the date in which RMRC became a Life Active Member of ESAF.

To record the date in which the Rocky Mountain Regional Council Endowment was established.

Article V: Duties of Officers

Now reads:

Article V: Duties of Officers

Section 1. The President shall preside at the meetings of the RMRC. She may appoint committees as needed. She will confer with the hostess state of the Roundup regarding activities to be held. She shall cast the ballot for the RMRC for the I.C. election of officers at the I.C. Convention. She will not need to confer with the member States to make this decision.

Proposed to read:

Section 1. The President shall perform the following duties:

Preside at the meetings of the RMRC.

Appoint committees as needed.

Confer with the hostess state of the Roundup regarding activities to be held.

Cast the ballot for the RMRC for IC election of officers at the IC convention.

Will not need to confer with the member state to make this decision.

Proposed to add:

By virtue of the office, the RMRC President shall be the contact to Epsilon Sigma Alpha Foundation for the Rocky Mountain Regional Council Endowment.

Continued



Reason for change:

To clarify the contact person for the Rocky Mountain Regional Council Endowment.

Now Reads:

Section 2. The Vice President/President Elect by virtue of her office shall automatically fill the office of President if there is a vacancy and at the end of the President's term of office. She shall assume the duties of the President in the latter's absence.

Proposed to read:

Section 2. The Vice President shall perform the following duties:

By virtue of the office shall automatically fill the office of President if there is a vacancy and at the end of the President's term of office.

Shall assume the duties of the President in the latter's absence.

Now Reads:

Section 3. The Secretary/Treasurer shall keep records of all meetings. Minutes shall be mailed to RMRC officers, State Presidents, and the IC Representative. She shall handle all monies of the RMRC and shall pay out money upon direction of the RMRC. She shall pay dues to the International Council by October 1st each year. She shall file a Tax Facts Report with ESA Headquarters by the due date of September 15th each year.

Propose to read:

Section 3. The Secretary /Treasurer shall perform the following duties:

Keep records of all meetings. Minutes shall be mailed to RMRC officers, State Presidents, and the IC Representative.

Handle all monies of the RMRC and shall pay out money upon direction of the RMRC. Pay dues to the International Council by October 1st each year.

File a Tax Facts Report with ESA Headquarters by the September 15th due date each year.

Reason for change:

ESA is now a service organization with both male and female members. The changes are to make the descriptions gender neutral.




jump suits was very interesting with the elaborate designs on each outfit. Some of them must have been quite heavy with all the jewels attached.






St. Jude Events at IC



What an honor to visit St. Jude Children's Research Hospital while we were at International Convention in Memphis! No matter how many times I've visited, I'm always in awe of the hospital and the care and concern of the staff for the patients and their families. There are no words to describe the feeling. I'm sure those who visited the hospital feel the same way.

On our tour, we did have the opportunity to visit the ESA area.





I also had an opportunity to tour the Enterprise Center located in the old Sears Tower. The Center has 300 employees and is open from 7:00am to 9:00pm. The "Call Center" for our Dream Homes is housed here. In the hallway is a timeless photo of Danny Thomas when the statute of St. Jude is unveiled; his face says it all.

Friday night was the "Walkin' in Memphis" IC Challenge. We were bused to the Domino's Event Center on the Hospital campus. The event raised over \$56,294; this is the most the IC Challenge has every raised! A nurse from the hospital gave an inspirational presentation regarding her career with St. Jude and the patients she has worked with. When the patients leave the hospital, the staff sings the "You Don't Get Chemo Anymore!!!" departure song that she wrote. The highlight of the challenge was to walk from the Event Center thru the campus to the front of the Hospital where another iconic photo, replicating the photo taken at IC Convention in 2000, was taken.

Saturday night was the St. Jude presentation of dollars. What a celebration as we reached the unbelievable total of \$290,443,946 in the 47 years ESA has supported the Hospital. This last year alone, ESA raised \$22,806,798. Congratulations!!

As this year closes, I'll be traveling to Memphis to participate in the Memphis Marathon December 7 as team captain for *Team ESA*. That too is a humbling experience to see 30,000 people run for the kids at St. Jude.
