Disaster Fund Chair

For those members who may be new to ESA, I would like to remind you that the purpose of the Disaster Fund is to assist ESA members whose home and/or personal belongings are destroyed or damaged extensively by one of nature's causes - fire, flood, tornado, etc.

Assistance may also be given when a member incurs heavy financial responsibility due to a debilitating illness or accident, which involves the ESA member or their immediate family who reside in their home and for whom they are legally responsible.

One can never anticipate when disaster money will be needed. \$5,000 is the maximum amount given to a member of a Disaster claim. The International Council Disaster Fund Chair determines the total amount to be paid based on the nature of the claim.

To date, Colorado has not submitted any claims. If anyone in your chapter does have a need, please contact me.

I want to thank those who have donated to the Disaster Fund. To date. I've turned in donations totaling \$2,655 from:

- Three individuals
- 4 Chapters
- 2 Councils
- Lamplighters
- Raffle

To date donations to IC have totaled \$10,589.75 and there have been 6 claims paid for a total of \$25,312.95.

Please consider the Disaster Fund this year when you are designating where your philanthropic funds should go.

At the Fall Leadership Meeting in Frisco, Colorado there were two Standing Rules changed, voted on and passed.

A motion was made to allow the Golden Lamp Editor to set the price for **printed subscriptions to non-Presidents** each year.

It was seconded, motion carried.

TO READ: Item 4. Colorado State Council Standing Rules

The State Council shall sponsor a newsletter, <u>The Golden Lamp</u>, publishing six (6) issues per year in the months of August, October, December, February, April and June. The deadline will be the first of each month and published on or before the fifteenth of each month. The cost of printed subscriptions for <u>non-Presidents</u>, shall be set by the Golden Lamp Editor each year.

It was proposed that the pin fines be increased from \$0.25 to \$1.00. It was seconded, motion carried.

TO READ: Item 5. Colorado State Council Standing Rules

Members not wearing their sorority pin at State Council meetings will be fined **\$1.00 (One Dollar)** with the proceeds going to the State Treasury.

"Standing Rules may be amended or rescinded by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the General Board"

They are not subject to the "every other year" clause the ByLaws are.

These changes will be posted on the Web Site and published in the Golden Lamp.





Of the Month (AGAIN!)

Dixie Daly,

Sigma Rho

Loveland CO

Dixie Daly has sponsored four new members into the Sigma Rho chapter since September, **in addition** to the 4 new members she sponsored last year. When asked about her remarkable success in sharing the gift of ESA, she is quick to say, "It's all about the ASK! I am always on the lookout for people who I think are like us --like Sigma Rho members, I mean I keep an eye out for people who I see give of their time to something in our community already because that helps me know they'll like what we do in ESA. And I look for people who are HAPPY, because we are a happy group and really value that in one another."



Dixie works for the Chamber of Commerce in Loveland and attends Chamber and other civic events regularly. "Sometimes, I think the tendency in ESA is to shy away from inviting someone to join ESA who already volunteers elsewhere because we figure their time is spoken for. But I've found the opposite to be true. People who like to give are often receptive to new ways to do that because they enjoy it so much. So when it comes up in conversation with someone that they are helping a project or cause, I perk right up."

So what makes a successful "Ask"? Dixie explains, "I say to someone, 'That's great you help that cause.
