Bylaw Committee

The proposed *revised* Bylaws have been posted to our website (thanks Candie). Please discuss at your chapter meetings. The Bylaw Committee tried to revise the Bylaws to make them more concise and user friendly, keeping our focus on "what is best for Colorado State Council (CSC)."

Here's a summary of the proposed changes to the Elected and Appointed offices:


- Rename Senior Past President to Past President. Their duties are to serve as Awards Chairman and promote bids for State Convention.
- Eliminate Vice President. Their membership duties were moved to President-Elect and promote convention bids to Past President.
- Eliminate Jr Past President. The Treasurer would collect for Disaster Fund.
- Eliminate Corresponding Secretary. The Recording Secretary will handle the correspondence. An appointed office, Communication Coordinator, was created to assist the President in preparing the Yearbook and promoting the use of social media.
- Add appointed position, Communication Coordinator. Duties would include those of Corresponding Secretary with more of an emphasis on modern communication, including Facebook, or any other appropriate social media.
- Tasks that were in the Bylaws will be included in the officer's guidelines if they aren't already.

During the process, the Executive Board members not serving on the Bylaw Committee were asked to provide their input, which was incorporated into the proposed *revised* Bylaws.

Because the proposed changes to the bylaws are extensive, the proposed bylaws are a "revision" which when approved will replace the existing bylaws. There are a few changes that also affect the Standing Rules. Both documents have been posted on our CSC website and will be voted on at State Convention.
