Lamplighter's Scholarships – Billie Jean Farnham, Chairman

The Lamplighters maintain three scholarships through the ESA Foundation's Endowment Program. At present time, the Lamplighters have three scholarships. They are listed as Colorado Lamplighters Endowment, Colorado Lamplighters/Beta Omicron Endowment, and Kay McLaughlin Memorial Endowment. Legal responsibility for management of the Endowments rests with the ESA Foundation Board of Directors. The amount of each scholarship to be awarded each year is based on a three-year rolling spending rate. The Restricted account principal is \$5,000. This amount cannot be used as part of the funds that are available for amounts determined for scholarships each year. Each scholarship is funded by the Lamplighters and these are noted as Available Funds, which are then given out on

the basis determined by the Foundation Endowment Board of Directors. The Lamplighters have been advised that two scholarships will be awarded for the 2017-18 academic year. One is for \$600 and the other for \$500. One scholarship did not have sufficient funds available and therefore, no monies will be awarded from it this year. The Lamplighters are very proud of their scholarships and want you, the membership, to know what is available for family or friends who may have children in need of a scholarship. Just a note, there are other chapters in Colorado that have scholarships, but we do not have any information on those. The Scholarships are published each year in the ESA Foundation Newsletter.

COLORADO STATE COUNCIL BID FOR COLORADO STATE CONVENTION

The annual Colorado State Council Convention shall be in the spring of the year, prior to the International Convention, the date to be determined each year. (The date has traditionally been the weekend after Mother's Day.) During the annual Colorado State Council Convention each year, the location of the Convention two (2) years hence shall be determined by the presentation of bids that are voted on by the members in attendance.

The Colorado State Council Convention hosts shall be responsible for the following:

- A. Selecting the Convention date and place, setting the amount of the registration fee, and making arrangements for all events necessary for the annual State Convention.
- B. Providing accommodations for the State Council President and I.C. Representative attending State Convention.
- C. Conducting a drawing at the Friday Night Mixer for one (1) free registration to the State Convention.
- D. Preparing a report to be given at the Second General Assembly to include the total number of persons registered at the Convention with the breakdown of active members, members-at-large and guests.
- E. Presenting the Convention guidebook to the newly elected Convention host at the conclusion of the Convention.
- F. One dollar (\$1.00) from each Convention registration will be given to the State Treasurer, no later than June 20th following the close of Convention, to be given to the working fund for the following State Conventions.
- G. Convention host chapter shall work with the presiding Colorado State President to arrange her visit to the Convention site for assessment of proposed Convention facilities and arrangements.
