
A Jewel Pin Ceremony was given for Karen Pearce - after passing the stressful "Ideals Test"! This lady is going to keep us going, she is so full of energy!

It all began so primitively, by just sending a simple shout out on Facebook asking if people could save coupons for me. As coupons started to arrive I got an un-expected gift from my Uncle Bob, he is retired Army and an avid coupon clipper. He brought me two boxes of coupons, then a few weeks later a few more. For the next couple of weeks I did nothing but stare at the daunting pile of paper before me. However, I know that my Sigma Rho Sisters wouldn’t let me down.



So we planned an evening at my home to make quick work of these piles.

We got together on a Wednesday evening and I made dinner. I asked them to bring scissors, markers and Ziploc baggies as those were the tools we would need to get to work on this Troopon. We visited and laughed and enjoyed each other’s company as we busily clipped and sorted the coupons. We quickly found other ways to clip faster than cutting one by one. As coupons were flying we were sorting and stacking like mad women! HA!

We then placed them into the sandwich baggies and used the markers to label each bag. As the gals and I decided to stop for the night we looked at the table and realized we barely made a dent in my stash of coupons. So as sisters do, we started getting out bags and taking stacks home. I was left with baggies full of sorted coupons with the task of totaling each baggies value so that the folks at Support Our Troops could keep track of the value that this program was bringing to the troops overseas. It was amazing to me to find out that magazines and newspapers overseas don’t have coupons in them. However by us doing this small project we can help support the military families spread their money. Our first box was sent off today totaling a savings to our deployed troops of \$6,045.97 WOW! HOLY MOLY! This IS going to make a difference! Since our first box we have sent two more boxes totaling over \$30,000!


Fall Leadership Meeting - Frisco, CO
