

Volunteer Management System

At Spring Board, the new signup for ALSAC sponsored events for St. Jude was presented. The web-based Volunteer Management System (VMS) was rolled out to the state St. Jude Coordinators in January. We will not be using Signup Genius or Volunteer Signup that we used in the past. The Colorado Springs St. Jude Dream Home Giveaway has been selected to test the system for ESA.

After Spring Board, we followed up with an email to everyone with sign up tips and the "VMS how to sign up handout." Let us know if you did not receive the email. VMS tracks the hours you've worked at an event; you'll need to include your travel time on your philanthropic report. ALSAC will provide reports to the Dream Home Co-Chairs prior to an event to ensure we have proper staffing. VMS is now open to the general public to sign up to volunteer at the events; ESA will still be able to sign up. This is a recruitment tool for ESA.






Spring Leadership ~ RMV Easterseals Camp
