

This is certainly a time for all of us to read or listen to audio books.




Theta Eta #2830 Publicity Report – April 1, 2020

Monday ESA Coffee Chat with ESA's Executive Director

Monday, March 30th, was the second Zoom meeting with our Executive Director, Charlotte Carloni, and ESA members from across the country. Charlotte passed along the information from the meeting and asked that we share the updates with our chapter and state.

Special guest, Rich Peterson from ALSAC, shared a video with a message from Rick Shadyac to St. Jude's major partners and donors: "St. Jude is doing everything possible to protect the vulnerable children in our care. Patients battling cancer and other diseases are extremely vulnerable to contagious viruses. The medical leaders are strictly limiting visits to St. Jude to essential personnel only. They have put in place recommended safe guards including having many ALSAC and St. Jude staff members work from home temporarily. Fund raising events have been postponed and we've educated the work force on the best practices to avoid contracting or spreading COVID-19. We are working to organize virtual events so you can hear directly what's happening at St. Jude during these unprecedented times. As Danny Thomas often said, Success has nothing to do with what you gain in life or accomplish for yourself; it's what you do for others! Thank you, thank you, from the bottom of my heart for all you do for the kids at St. Jude."
