Colorado State Council 2020-2021 Hope for Heroes Chair - Susie Morris

As our CSC Hope for Heroes Chair this year, even amidst this pandemic, I'm extra hopeful, as our fabulous IC President LeAnn Wray and IC Hope for Heroes Chair - Julene Donnay, have THREE exciting opportunities of what we can safely do in ESA for Hope for Heroes:

- 1. Welcome Home Vets: a program that provides a "home coming kit" to Veterans that are moving into a new apartment or living quarters after having been homeless for a large variety of reasons. The program initially was being done in Minnesota, but we are very lucky to work with the Welcome Home team and the Elks Lodges across many states and now are making connections for several states to start doing the same. The average "home coming kit" is \$400.
- 2. Folds of Honor: a program that offers scholarships to all Veterans' family members if the Veteran was wounded or killed in action. The opportunities to work with Folds of Honor are numerous and can be done on a small scale or a large scale. Please send names & addresses if you know of someone.
- 3. Wreaths Across America: this program assists in placing wreaths on the graves of our fallen from all wars that are buried in a National Military Cemetery or possibly ask for approval at local cemeteries as the "Laying of the Wreaths" is on December 19th, 2020.

How am I following through so far with all these amazing opportunities?

-I am working with a friend and her contact @ our local Elks Club to possibly set up a "Welcome Home Vets" program. The Folds of Honor, I'll need to follow through on the links they sent me and accumulate names & addresses of applicants. With Wreaths Across America, I'm going to follow through on the links as well and see if we have an organization already ordering wreaths.

Also, in the works:

- -I am selling Soldiers Angels "dog tag" necklaces for \$10 each that we decided @ Fall Board Planning Meeting. I have 70 necklaces that were donated by Shirley Telinde and I'm able to order more to sell as well. - -I have a "Raffle Basket" that we will draw for at CSC 2021 Convention. Tickets are \$1 each or 6 tickets for \$5. 




