Love in ESA Jenniffer Carlson-Mazza The St. Jude Dream Home Giveaway was created in 1991 by Dr. Donald Mack, a pediatric physician from Shreveport, Louisiana. He was a member of the ALSAC/St. Jude Children's Research Hospital Board of Directors and Governors; relying on St. Jude to treat many of his young patients with catastrophic diseases. Dr. Mack passed away this spring. The first St. Jude Dream Home was constructed in Shreveport and raised \$160,000 for the hospital. Today, there are more than 40 Dream Home Giveaways across the country; it is one of the largest fund-raisers for the hospital nationwide. Colorado is very fortunate to have two Dream Homes.

Kudos to our **Colorado Springs** Dream Home Team selling 11,000 tickets!! The drawing was June 29 on KKTV Colorado Springs. This was their 9th Dream Home by Covington Homes.

The **Denver** Dream Home campaign will kick off August 25. This is the 12th Dream Home for Denver; we will be selling 20,000 tickets. There will be four open house weekends beginning Saturday, September 17, from 10:00am to 5:00pm and Sunday's noon to 5:00pm. The last open house is Sunday, October 9. The drawing is October 13 on KDVR, Fox 31. For those interested in helping with the open houses, a link will be sent out later for Sign Up Genius.

Denver received 1st place recognition during the IC Awards luncheon for last year's Dream Home, raising \$1,379,021 for St. Jude. During the celebration of dollars at the Saturday evening banquet, Colorado received the \$22 Million Pinnacle Award and placed second for most dollars raised in 2021-2022. The annual and lifetime totals raised for St. Jude celebrated at IC were corrected in the ESA HQ 2022 IC Convention Recap emailed August 5. The 2021-2022 corrected total raised is \$14,126,508 and the Lifetime cumulative total is \$341,437,448. What an awesome feeling to be able to support the kids at St. Jude!




Hello Fellow Members!!!

RECIPE CORNER

NO BAKE COOKIES

- ½ Cup Milk
- ½ Cup Butter
- 2 Tablespoons
 Unsweetened Cocoa
 Powder
- ½ Cup Crunchy Peanut Butter
- 3 Cups Quick-Cooking Oats
- 1 Teaspoon Vanilla Extract

Instructions

In a medium saucepan, combine sugar, milk, butter, and cocoa.
Bring to a boil and cook for 1 1/2 minutes. Remove from heat, and stir in peanut butter, oats, and vanilla. Drop by teaspoonfuls onto wax paper. Let cool until hardened.



BEEF AND MACARONI SOUP

- 1 pound lean ground beef
- ½ cup onion diced
- 6 cups beef broth
- 14 ounces diced tomatoes
- 2 tablespoons tomato paste
- 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- ½ teaspoon oregano
- ½ teaspoon dried basil
- 1 ½ cups elbow macaroni uncooked
- 1 ½ cups frozen mixed vegetables

Instructions

- 1. In a large soup pot brown beef and onion until no pink remains. Drain any fat.
- 2. Add broth, tomatoes, tomato paste, Worcestershire sauce, and seasonings. Bring to a boil. Simmer 5 minutes.
- 3. Stir in macaroni noodles and vegetables, simmer an additional 8 minutes or until macaroni is tender. Season with salt & pepper to taste.
- 4. Serve with shredded cheese if desired.
