

Do you have questions regarding motions? Check out the ESA Colorado Chapter Took Kit on our website. The Tool Kit is listed under the Yearbook. After you click on the Tool Kit; scroll down to Parliamentary Tidbits, click on "meaty tidbit" where you will find answers to motions and other parliamentary information. ESA Foundation presented a workshop this Spring on the ABCs of Parliamentary Procedures. You can find the presentation on ESA Foundation News - Epsilon Sigma Alpha (ESA) - An International Service Organization. Just highlight, past in your browser, and click "Open Hyperlink" to view the workshop or view the power point.

Those who attended Fall Board approved the proposed Standing Rule changes which have been updated and posted on our Colorado website. Changes included grammatical corrections, removal of the term raffle as a license is required from the Secretary of State to hold a raffle, removal of the term sorority as both men and women are members, and items referring to the budget.

If you have any proposed Bylaw recommendations, please forward to me in writing by December 15 per Article XVI. The Bylaw Committee will review all recommendations. The proposed amendments will be posted on our website by February 1, read at both Spring Board and State Convention where they will be adopted.

Standing Rule and Bylaw changes affect the Guidelines which will be updated after the 2024 State Convention.

ST. JUDE WALK/RUN

The St. Jude 5K Walk/Run was in Denver, CO on September 23rd. It was such an amazing set up. They had different booths with free items, they had a food tent set up called Kay Kafe just like the café in the hospital.

A few other booths were the Butterfly Garden, where you write in memory of someone, and tape it onto the garden wall. They had a tent where you could color a picture for a patient. The tent was covered in pictures that patients had drawn.

They had a huge stage with a DJ who played a lot of fun music. A marching band and performers showed up and played. Dinger from the Rockies was there signing autographs.

There was a family there who spoke about their daughter. At age 2, just before Christmas they were given the news that she only had a couple months to live. After they received the news that changed their life, they were introduced to St. Jude and today she is 5 years old and cancer free.

The family fun zone was a blast. It had games, face painting, and a cartoonist.

The walk was 3.1 miles. It was such a nice day to walk, it was a little cool and breezy. 922 participants either ran or walked. People enjoying their time chatting with others as they walked, meeting new people, and other encouraging some that they finish.

As of that day they had raised over \$200,000.00.


SENIOR PAST PRESIDENT/AWARDS

Adi has raised over \$10,000.00 in one year for St. Jude Children's Research Hospital.



RUBY RED BEET AND APPLE SALAD

- 2 ½ Lbs. fresh beets (about 8 medium)
- 2 medium apples (peeled and chopped)
- 1 cup fresh kale (chopped)
- 1 cup red cabbage (chopped)
- 1 cup carrots (shredded)
- ½ cup onions (chopped)
- ½ cup cider vinegar
- ½ cup olice oil
- 2 tbsp honey
- 1 tsp salt
- ¼ tsp curry power
- 1/8 tsp ground ginger, garlic powder, and pepper
- Scrub beets and trim tops to 1 inch. Place in a dutch oven; add water to cover. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer covered 30-60 minutes or until tender
- 2. Peel beets and cut into 1/2" cubes. In a large bowl; combine apples, kale, cabbage, carrots, onion, and beets.
- 3. In a small bowl, whisk the remaining ingredients. Pour over salad; toss to coat. Refrigerate, covered for at least 4 hours or until chilled. Stirring occasionally

HOT CHICKEN SALAD

- 4 cups cold cooked chicken chunks (I use a roasted chicken)
- 2 tbsp lemon juice
- 2 cups diced celery
- ¾ cups mayonnaise
- ¾ cups cream of chicken soup
- 4 hard cooked eggs
- 1 tsp salt
- 1 tsp finely minced onion
- ½ small jar pimentos
- 1. Combine all ingredients and put in a large rectangular baking dish
- 2. Top with 1 cup grated cheese, 1 ½ cup crushed potato chips, and 2/3 cup finely chopped toasted almonds
- 3. Refrigerate overnight
- 4. Bake at 400 degrees for 20-25 minutes
- 5. Serve hot




